### Notice

A Fresno City College Student reported that on Wednesday, March 1, 2017 at approximately 8:00 p.m. he was in the smoking area commonly referred to as the "East Pit" on University Mall, on the Fresno City College campus. A subject, he did not know, arrived and soon exposed his genitals and began performing a lewd act, in violation of California Penal Code Sections 314 and 647(a).

The victim confronted the subject, which caused the suspect to flee the area. Because of darkness, the victim gave a limited description. The suspect is described as a Hispanic Male Adult, approximately 5' 8" tall and weighing about 160 pounds. The suspect wore an orange jacket, grey shorts and appeared to be limping

It is clear the suspect picked an isolated area and used the cover of darkness to exhibit his criminal behavior on a random, lone, victim. Due to this crime occurring on the Fresno City College campus, there is a concern for the safety and welfare of the students, faculty, staff and visitors. We urge all students, faculty and staff to be aware of their surroundings. Do not isolate yourself and partner with someone you know and trust when on campus at night. If this type of behavior is observed by anyone on campus, do not attempt to confront or detain the suspect; immediately report the crime to District Police.
